

## Looking for Participants.

Master's Project on the pulp and paper and logging industries in Central Newfoundland.

Hello,

My name is Bryan Marsh and I am a graduate student with the Department of History at Memorial University.

I am currently working on a project detailing the history of the pulp and paper industry in Central Newfoundland. As part of this project I am looking for former loggers and paper mill workers who might wish to be interviewed. In addition I would also be interested in interviewing wives and family members of those that worked as loggers and paper mill workers; and people that grew up in any communities in which the Anglo-Newfoundland Development Company had a presence (Grand Falls, Millertown, Badger, Bishop's Falls, Botwood, Terra Nova, Gambo.) Any insight from working in this industry is welcomed, and I am particularly interested in talking to those that worked as loggers from the 1950s up until the closure of the Grand Falls mill in 2009.

Interviews will be conducted via telephone, email, via skype or Facebook Messenger, or in person if possible. The interviews should take between about 60 minutes, possibly longer depending on the amount of information being shared. The interviews will be audio recorded and useful information incorporated into my Master's thesis.
